

ABOUT THE WORKSHOP

What do we mean when talking about the city, and how can interdisciplinarity work? These are the two major themes of the workshop. An engagement with the first question seeks to problematize an inherent tension within urban future-making: although we habitually refer to the urban level, the challenges are global in nature - with highly localized impacts. The second question ensues from the quest for coherence within the Research Training Group: how might different disciplines, and thus different vocabularies, different paradigms and different epistemologies be integrated in order to shed light on the team's shared problematic? Almost a year into the voyage, we already start to sense conceptual frictions and disciplinary camps - shall we call it, in the German tradition, a Methodenstreit?

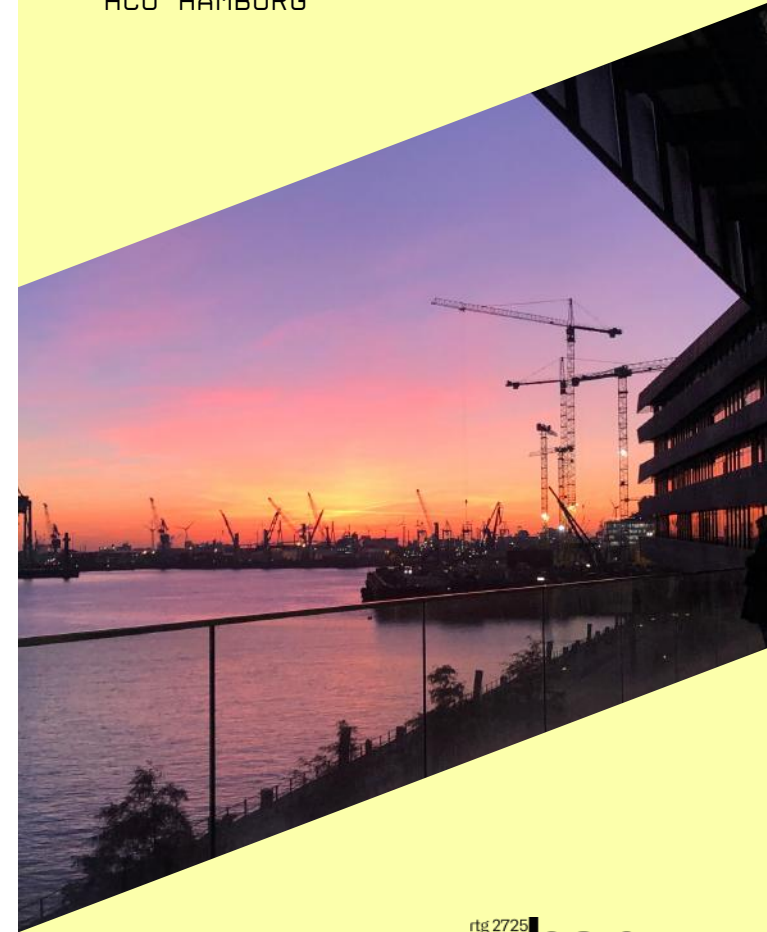
BY PUBLIC TRANSPORT:
